#### (F) Astrophysical neutrino observations

Neutrinos and antineutrinos produced in the atmosphere induce  $\mu$ -like and e-like events in underground detectors. The ratio of the numbers of the two kinds of events is defined as  $\mu/e$ . It has the advantage that that systematic effects, such as flux uncertainty, tend to cancel, for both experimental and theoretical values of the ratio. The "ratio of the ratios" of experimental to theoretical  $\mu/e$ ,  $R(\mu/e)$ , or that of experimental to theoretical  $\mu/total$ ,  $R(\mu/total)$  with total =  $\mu+e$ , is reported below. If the actual value is not unity, the value obtained in a given experiment may depend on the experimental conditions.
