Heavy Bosons Other Than Higgs Bosons, Searches for

We list here various limits on charged and neutral heavy vector bosons (other than W's and Z's), heavy scalar bosons (other than Higgs bosons), vector or scalar leptoquarks, and axigluons.

## W<sub>R</sub> (Right-Handed W Boson) MASS LIMITS

Assuming a light right-handed neutrino, except for BEALL 82, LANGACKER 89B, and COLANGELO 91.  $g_R = g_L$  assumed. [Limits in the section MASS LIMITS for W' below are also valid for  $W_R$  if  $m_{
u_R} \ll m_{W_R}$ .] Some limits assume manifest left-right symmetry, i.e., the equality of left- and right Cabibbo-Kobayashi-Maskawa matrices. For a comprehensive review, see LANGACKER 89B. Limits on the  $W_I$  -  $W_R$ mixing angle  $\zeta$  are found in the next section. Values in brackets are from cosmological and astrophysical considerations and assume a light right-handed neutrino.

The following limits are obtained from  $p\overline{p} \rightarrow W' X$  with W' decaying to the mode indicated in the comments. New decay channels (e.g.,  $W' \rightarrow WZ$ ) are assumed to be suppressed. UA1 and UA2 experiments assume that the  $t \overline{b}$  channel is not open.
