## b-baryon ADMIXTURE MEAN LIFE

Each measurement of the $b$-baryon mean life is an average over an admixture of various $b$ baryons which decay weakly. Different techniques emphasize different admixtures of produced particles, which could result in a different $b$-baryon mean life. More $b$-baryon flavor specific channels are not included in the measurement.
"OUR EVALUATION" is an average using rescaled values of the data listed below. The average and rescaling were performed by the Heavy Flavor Averaging Group (HFAG) and are described at http://www.slac.stanford.edu/xorg/hfag/. The averaging/rescaling procedure takes into account correlations between the measurements and asymmetric lifetime errors.

## $b$-baryon ADMIXTURE DECAY MODES $\left(\Lambda_{b}, \bar{\Xi}_{b}, \Sigma_{b}, \Omega_{b}\right)$

These branching fractions are actually an average over weakly decaying $b$-baryons weighted by their production rates in $Z$ decay (or high-energy $p \bar{p}$ ), branching ratios, and detection efficiencies. They scale with the LEP $b$-baryon production fraction $\mathrm{B}(b \rightarrow b$-baryon) and are evaluated for our value $\mathrm{B}(b \rightarrow b$-baryon $)=(9.2 \pm 1.8) \%$.

The branching fractions $\mathrm{B}\left(b\right.$-baryon $\rightarrow \Lambda \ell^{-} \bar{\nu}_{\ell}$ anything $)$ and $\mathrm{B}\left(\Lambda_{b}^{0} \rightarrow\right.$ $\Lambda_{c}^{+} \ell^{-} \bar{\nu}_{\ell}$ anything) are not pure measurements because the underlying measured products of these with $\mathrm{B}(b \rightarrow b$-baryon) were used to determine $\mathrm{B}(b \rightarrow b$-baryon $)$, as described in the note "Production and Decay of $b$-Flavored Hadrons."

For inclusive branching fractions, e.g., $B \rightarrow D^{ \pm}$anything, the values usually are multiplicities, not branching fractions. They can be greater than one.
